Signs have been erected officially designating 14 blocks of First Street in Mount Vernon as an Iowa Cultural and Entertainment District. Mount Vernon received the designation from the state in 2019 following an application from the arts council. As a result of the designation, Mount Vernon will be listed in various tourism promotion materials distributed by the Iowa Department of Economic Development.



MOUNT VERNON POET LAUREATE 2021- 2022 SELECTED

Amelia Kibbie was selected as Mount Vernon's second poet laureate, a position created and supported by the arts council in partnership with the city. She succeeds Marianne Taylor. Amelia is a graduate of Mount Vernon High School and now lives and teaches in Lisbon. Mount Vernon is the smallest city in America with an official poet laureate.

LINCOLN HIGHWAY ARTS FESTIVAL WILL RETURN SEPTEMBER 18

After a year's hiatus, the annual Lincoln Highway Arts Festival will return to downtown Mount Vernon on Saturday Sept. 18. Applications are open for artists interested in participating.



POCKET PARK PUBLIC ART 2021

The MVAAC contributed \$10,000 for an artwork installation in Mount Vernon's new "Pocket Park" located on Main Street in the alley between the Sweet Factory and Scarlett Boutique. Following a call for artists which drew 33 responses from as far away as Greece, Tim Adams of Webster City, IA, was selected to create a metal wall sculpture that will be mounted on The Sweet Factory building. CHALK THE WALK 2020-2021

After a virtual Chalk the Walk in 2020, won by Mary Campbell (photo above), the 2021 event came roaring back with 150 artists participating. First place went to Bryce Cox, Mount Vernon resident and teacher, who was also the 2017 winner. The event drew large crowds anxious to get out of the house after 15 months of the pandemic.

FARM TO FORK EVENT 2021

The MVAAC received a \$2,000 grant from the Iowa Arts Council to sponsor a Farm to Fork event on Thursday, July 8 in conjunction with the local Farmers Market at the First Street Community Center. Local people involved in agriculture will work with former Iowa Poet Laureate and Iowa State University professor emerita Mary Swander to prepare stories about weather.

Other grants awarded in the past year went to the Uke Squad to publish a book of ukulele transcriptions, the MV-Lisbon Community Theatre for its upcoming Shakespeare play, to Mount Vernon High School to help host the WAMAC conference all-school arts workshops and exhibition, and to Mount Vernon Creates for its Artists Portrayal of Mount Vernon.

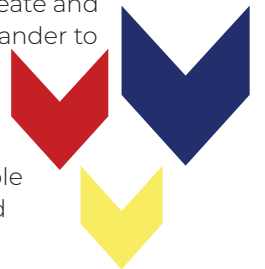
MONTHLY WRITERS NIGHT CONTINUES
